Any Southern State Community College associate degree graduate is accepted to DeVry University/Columbus into the Technical Management Bachelor Degree completion program. This program allows an associate degree graduate to complete a bachelor degree with a minimum of 62 semester hours at DeVry University/Columbus.

Each SSCC graduate will provide a transcript for evaluation and may transfer all academic credit with a grade of "C" or higher (2.0 on a 4.0 scale). Each applicant must have at least 60 academic semester hours or the equivalent, with a grade of "C" or higher from their associate degree.

DeVry University/Columbus will accept those credit hours described above and assist each applicant in selecting elective courses where applicable and determining the 62 semester hours (plus any prerequisite skills classes needed) of required coursework.

DeVry University/Columbus requires that the associates degree have a minimum of 12 semester hours (18 quarter hours) of general education course work and a minimum of 27 semester hours (40 quarter hours) in a cohesive occupational/vocational/technical sequence.
