ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

Southern State Community College and The University of Cincinnati

Bachelor of Science – Liberal Arts & Social Sciences: Addictions Focus

In order to be admitted to the Liberal Arts and Social Sciences Baccalaureate Program with the focus in Addictions Studies at the University of Cincinnati under this agreement, the student must complete the following requirements:

1. Completion of Southern State Community College’s Associate of Applied Science Degree in Corrections Technology.
2. Eligibility for admission to the University of Cincinnati under current admission requirements as outlined in the College Bulletin.

To achieve the objectives of a liberal education, all students pursuing a degree must complete basic core requirements in addition to two areas of concentration; a major and a minor area of study. Core requirements include course work in the areas of Humanities, Social Sciences, Mathematics and Natural Sciences. 186 quarter credit hours are required for graduation from the baccalaureate program.

At this time, The College of Education (and most colleges at the University of Cincinnati) requires that all transfer students with more than 90 hours; complete a minimum of two (2) courses which have been approved by the University’s General Education council, in order to earn a baccalaureate degree. The General Education Program at the University of Cincinnati, proposes a common set of requirements to be shared by all baccalaureate programs at the University. These requirements expose students to the main areas of traditional knowledge, as well as to current issues of our day. The courses are designed to teach critical thinking and at least one communication skill-oral, written or visual. When fully implemented, transfer students with more than 90 hours of advanced standing will need to complete three (3) General Education courses. Freshmen at the University will need to complete a total of eleven (11) General Education courses.

General education requirements should not require a student to take more than the “normal” 186 hours for graduation. Advisers will assist in the selection of such courses so that they will meet General Education requirements, while satisfying regular degree requirements. However, many, if not most, or courses students will need to take, must be at the 300 level or above.

It is understood that students cannot be matriculated at two colleges at the same time, however, by virtue of this agreement, students who complete the associate degree program from Southern State Community College, contained therein, are guaranteed admission into the University of Cincinnati’s Addictions Studies Program.

Consortium agreements have been designed so that students, while matriculated at one college, may use their financial aid to take courses at the partnering institution, as long as that course is applicable to the student’s degree requirements.

Transfer student must complete University of Cincinnati course requirements. The following courses will be transferred from Southern State Community College; and considered as meeting course requirements in The College of Education. The following chart represents the course substitutions allowed and the courses needed.
