PROGRAM COVERED:

Students from Southern State Community College completing the AA who are admitted to the College of Business may pursue the BBA degree in the concentrations listed in the current College of Business Bulletin. SSCC students who plan to opt for Information Systems as their Focus Concentration upon transferring to the College of Business are not required to take a General Education Science Elective at the University of Cincinnati, and the available number of Free Elective hours will change from fifteen hours to ten hours. To replace these hours Information Systems majors will complete 22-IS 212 and 321.

The AA program is **NOT** designed to articulate with the Bachelor of Science in Industrial Management. Students transferring into this program will have their credits assessed on an individual basis.

ADMISSION INTO THE COLLEGE OF BUSINESS:

The College of Business is a selective admissions college of the University of Cincinnati. Students should strive to exceed minimum standards for consideration. Meeting the minimum standard does not guarantee acceptance in to the College of Business.

The admissions standards of SSCC students who apply to transfer to the College of Business are a cumulative GPA of at least 2.50 from all colleges attended and successful completion (earned at least a D- grade with an AA or C- without an AA) of Finite Math (MATH 124) or College Algebra (MATH 141) **AND** Calculus for Business (MATH 241) in order to be considered for admission. The College of Business will guarantee admission to SSCC students who complete the Associate of Arts degree in Pre-Business and who have a cumulative grade point average of at least 3.00 from all colleges attended.

GRANTING OF JUNIOR STATUS:

All courses successfully completed at SSCC will transfer to the College of Business as detailed in the attached course equivalency table. Students who have completed the Associate of Arts degree and who have been admitted to the College of Business will be considered to have junior class rank upon completion of 91 quarter credit hours. These students will be allowed to take junior level courses from the College of Business with permission of an academic advisor from the College of Business. Students who choose to transfer to the College of Business without earning the Associate of Arts degree in Pre-Business will not be awarded junior level status and will not be permitted to enroll in junior level courses offered by the College of Business until they have completed all of the freshman and sophomore level core courses. Entrance into the concentration areas will be determined by the completion of all of the junior level core business courses.
