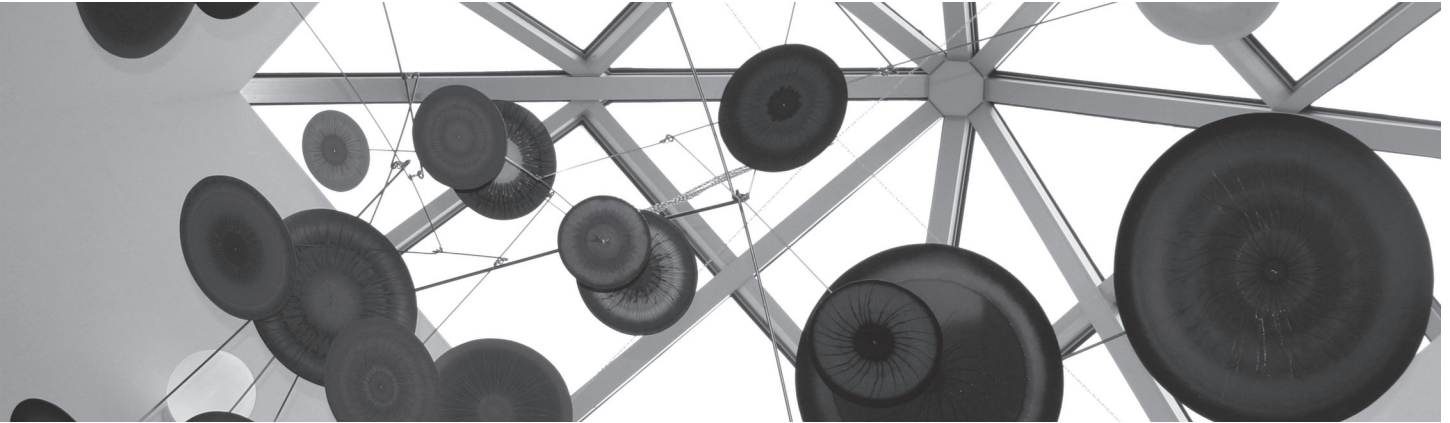

Transitioning into a new dimension - August 27, 2012

## Important Information about YOUR Financial Aid

Southern State Community College will change its academic calendar from the quarter system to the semester system, effective Fall 2012. Fall Semester will begin August 27, 2012.

**This transition will create changes in the way YOUR Financial Aid is handled.**

**NEW Process:** The typical academic year will consist of Fall and Spring Semesters with Summer Semester being the optional term. The yearly amount of grants and scholarship eligibility will be divided between the two semesters and the loans can be divided between the three semesters, if needed.

**For this Summer ONLY:** Summer 2012 will run as a Quarter term, and the semester conversion will begin with the Fall and Spring Semesters of 2012-2013. **If you have a Pell Grant for the current academic year (2011-2012) AND do not use your entire yearly amount, you may bring forward any unused Pell Grant into the Summer Quarter 2012.** (Example: If your total yearly Pell Grant is the maximum amount of \$5550, your eligibility would be a quarterly amount of \$1850 for full-time, \$1388 for 9 to 11 credit hours, \$925 for 6 to 8 credit hours, and \$463 for 1 to 5 credit hours.) If you have already received three full-time quarters this academic year ( $\$1850 \times 3$ ), you would have used your whole yearly amount of \$5550 and there is nothing to bring forward to the Summer Quarter 2012.

If you were full-time Fall Quarter (\$1850), 10 hours Winter Quarter (\$1388), and 8 hours Spring Quarter (\$925), you would have used \$4163 and could bring the difference of \$1387 forward to Summer Quarter 2012 ( $\$5550 - \$4163 = \$1387$ ). As long as you are only taking at least 9 to 11 credit hours, you would be eligible to receive the \$1387 for Summer Quarter.

**Student Loans:** The maximum freshman subsidized loan per academic year is \$3500. If you have not used your entire yearly amount, you may apply for the balance of the \$3500 and receive it for the Summer Quarter as well. After the Spring Quarter 2012 aid has been disbursed, we will calculate your remaining eligibility of

the current year's 2011-2012 and send you a notice as to what aid is available to you to MOVE FORWARD TO Summer Quarter 2012.

If you have used your total yearly amount of aid during the 2011-2012 academic year **BY ATTENDING FULL-TIME FOR THREE QUARTERS WITHIN THIS CURRENT ACADEMIC YEAR, there ARE zero dollars to bring forward and you should think very carefully before you use any of your new 2012-2013 grant or scholarship dollars for the Summer Quarter 2012. This will reduce your Fall and Spring Semester grants and scholarships greatly and you might end up with not enough aid to cover Spring Semester.** If your program requires you to attend during the Summer Quarter 2012 and you do not have any remaining aid from 2011-2012 to bring forward, you should only take out enough loan to cover your direct cost of tuition and books with no extra dollars for living expenses. This will leave you a greater amount of loans and all of your grants and scholarships to use towards your two semesters for the 2012-2013 academic year. The fees for the coming year have not been set as of this date, but we assume that the tuition would be the same as this year (\$3633 or \$1211 per quarter or \$1816.50 a semester). If you are eligible for the maximum Pell Grant of \$5550 or \$1850 per quarter, it would be equal to \$2750 per semester.

**Completing the 2012-2013 FAFSA:** As soon as you have filed your 2011 income tax return, you can complete the FAFSA. If you are returning to Southern State after the Spring Quarter of this year, please wait and complete the FAFSA after you have filed your 2011 income tax return so that you can click the button to allow the IRS to use your income tax information to fill in the FAFSA and cause fewer errors. If you plan to transfer out to another institution, you should file your FAFSA based on the deadline of the new institution.

# Registering for Classes/Schedule Changes

## Registering for Courses

### New Students:

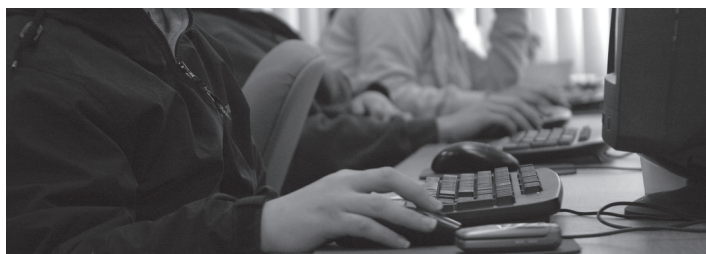
First-time entering freshman are encouraged to attend orientation. During orientation, a placement assessment will be conducted along with a review of college services, advising, and registration. Advising will be available on a first-come, first-serve basis.

For more information on becoming a student, visit the College's website at [www.sccc.edu/admissions/getting\\_started.htm](http://www.sccc.edu/admissions/getting_started.htm). In addition, interested individuals may also visit the Admissions Office located on the Central Campus in Hillsboro.

### Returning and Current Students:

Select the registration method most convenient for you. If you are registering online, you will need your User Id and a Personal Identification Number (PIN). New students will be sent information after their application for admission is approved. If you forget your PIN, you can have it reset to the default by contacting the College's Help Desk at 1-800-628-7722, ext. 2800, or by emailing [helpdesk@sccc.edu](mailto:helpdesk@sccc.edu)

- ▶ **Web Registration:** This registration method is available to students after their first quarter of attendance. Go online at [www.sccc.edu](http://www.sccc.edu). Click on Help buttons if you need assistance. Make sure you confirm your registration before exiting the program so your registration is saved. Arrangements for payment must be made to reserve your space in selected courses. You may print a copy of your registration and fee statement. **Web registration begins Tues., Feb. 21 for sophomores and Wed., Feb. 22 for freshman.**
- ▶ **In Person:** You may register in person on any campus in the Student Services Office. Complete a registration planning form, available on any campus, and give it to your registration representative. (Registration forms may also be accessed through the College's website at [www.sccc.edu/current\\_students/registration.htm](http://www.sccc.edu/current_students/registration.htm).) At the point of registration, you will be given a copy of your schedule and fee statement. **In-person registration begins Tues., Feb. 21 for sophomores and Wed., Feb. 22 for freshman.**



## Register for Classes Via the Web

Web registration is available to students after their first quarter of attendance. Log on to [www.sccc.edu](http://www.sccc.edu). At the "Student Quick Links" box in the top right corner, click on "MySSCC Portal." At the "My Student Records," click on *More Info*. At the login screen, enter your student ID# and password (\$\$cc+last 4 digits of your SS#). You will be required to change your password the first time you log on. If you forget your password, notify the help desk and it will be reset to the last four digits of your SS#.

- To register for classes, follow the onscreen directions. Enter course information under "search criteria" or "day/time options" to search for courses. Fast Search is not currently available.
- An outstanding account, prerequisites required, or other holds will prevent you from registering online. In these cases, you must go to the Student Services office to register for classes.
- Clicking on the course will show prerequisites, corequisites, number of students enrolled, number of seats still available, and number on waitlist.
- Don't forget to print a copy of your schedule and your bill. Students registering online are not automatically mailed a statement and schedule. (Account charges are not automatically generated at the time of registration. You may need to wait for charges to appear.)
- Students registering online must also follow the same payment deadlines.

## What if I need to change my schedule or withdraw from a class?

### Changing Classes

With an instructor's permission, a student can typically change a class during the first five days of the fall, winter, and spring quarters and during the first three days of a given summer term. Any course change is dependent on course availability and the permission of the instructor. To officially complete a course change, you must complete a Drop/Add Form, have "adds" signed by the instructor, and submit it to the Student Services Office.

### Dropping a Class

If you need to drop a course, you must officially withdraw from that course. Refer to the "Important Dates to Remember" section in this schedule booklet or online for dates by which to drop at 100 percent or officially withdraw. If you receive financial aid, contact the Financial Aid Office to discuss your responsibilities.

### Withdrawing

Anytime you choose to withdraw from a course, your decision must be carefully considered and discussed with your instructor regardless of the reason for the withdraw. Withdrawing from a course has many implications that are often overlooked and unexpected. Student financial aid and enrollment status are two of the most critical factors that are affected by your decision to withdraw from a course. Depending on the timing of the withdrawal, you could jeopardize your financial aid and end up being responsible to pay back a portion of the financial aid to the federal government. Financial aid students should contact the Financial Aid Office at 1-800-628-7722, ext. 2610 prior to withdrawing from any class. They will assist you in the appropriate time to withdraw.

More importantly, it is vital that you speak with your instructor prior to withdrawing. SSCC instructors recognize that students have to withdraw for various reasons including reasons in which they can offer little assistance; however, in many cases, they can help but they must be notified of your challenges first. Regardless of your reason to withdraw, always speak to your instructor first.

Lastly, concerning withdrawing, it is vital that you follow procedures for properly withdrawing. Withdrawal forms are available on each campus but the form must be completed and submitted before you are "officially" withdrawn. Never assume that by simply not attending class, you have officially withdrawn.

# MySSCC/Distance Education

## MySSCC

Southern State Community College students have the ability to access their records and accounts, online courses (My Blackboard) and email using “MySSCC.” Web registration is available to students after their first quarter of attendance. How to access these services:

- Go to [www.sccc.edu](http://www.sccc.edu)
- Locate “Student Quick Links” box in the top right corner
- Click on “MySSCC Portal”

Outlined below is the step-by-step process for entering IDs and passwords:

### My Student Records

- Username is your student ID number. (Enter without dashes.)
- Your initial password is \$\$cc + the last four digits of your social security number (example: \$\$cc1234)
- Once you enter My Student Records, you will be prompted to change your password. (Be sure to record your new password.)

### My Blackboard (Online Courses)

- Your ID is the first four (4) characters of your last name followed by the 10<sup>th</sup> through the 13<sup>th</sup> digits of your student ID barcode number.
- Your initial password is \$\$cc + the last four digits of your social security number (example: \$\$cc1234)
- Once you enter the My Blackboard account, change this password to a number you will remember. (Be sure to record your new password.)

**Southern State has a new learning management system, Blackboard Learn 9.1 (<https://blackboard.sccc.edu>).** Blackboard Learn 9.1 has exciting new social learning and teaching tools that foster more logical, visually impactful, and active learning opportunities for students, helping them stay connected to their educational experience. The new Blackboard Learn 9.1 also has Blackboard Mobile Learn, a free mobile application that brings two-way teaching and learning to mobile devices and gives students full access to their course information directly from their smartphones.

Currently, Southern State is running Blackboard 8 and Blackboard Learn 9.1 side by side until the end of Summer Quarter. Students may have courses in both Learning Management Systems. The link to the New Blackboard Learn 9.1 is on the <https://portal.sccc.edu/bboard.htm>.

### My Mail (Student Email)

- Your ID is the first four (4) characters of your last name followed by the 10<sup>th</sup> through the 13<sup>th</sup> digits of your student ID barcode number.
- Your initial password is \$\$cc + the last four digits of your social security number (example: \$\$cc1234)

(Example: A student named Jane Smith enrolls in an online course. Her Student ID barcode number is 27722123456789. Her Social Security number is 987-64-4321. ### Student Drive Features

Student drive (M:) has been replaced with the Microsoft Live@edu Skydrive. The benefits of this is 25GB space and access anywhere you can connect to the Internet, whether on campus or at home.

## Distance Education at SSCC

Southern State offers many distance education courses for students with flexible scheduling needs. Distance education courses cover the same content as traditional face-to-face courses, are taught by qualified SSCC instructors, and meet all degree and transfer requirements. Distance education courses include online, hybrid, and live classroom courses. Information for each type of distance education course is provided below.

Before registering for any distance education course, students must review all information posted on the **My Blackboard** page on the college’s website:

This page states requirements that all distance education students must meet, provides instructions for getting started in a distance education course, and offers guidelines to help students decide if distance education is right for them.

Students visiting the **My Blackboard** page should take special note of the information provided in the **Requirements** section, especially **Instructor Requirements**. Instructor requirements may include special hardware or software requirements, completion of an orientation, dates for on-campus class meetings, or e-mail contact with the instructor prior to the quarter.

**Students should not sign up for a distance education course unless they know they can meet all requirements found on the My Blackboard page, including all Instructor Requirements.**

Students should note that while distance education courses may be an excellent option for some, these courses are very challenging. They are only a good fit for students who are extremely self-disciplined and who have the time and skills necessary to succeed. For example, distance education students must be good at working on their own and meeting deadlines. They must be able to communicate well in writing and follow written instructions. Better than average computer and internet skills are critical. At the very least, students should know how to use e-mail, post to bulletin boards, and upload and download files.

### Types of Distance Education Courses:

**Online:** These courses meet primarily online, but students may need to come to campus for orientation and/or exams. A time commitment of 12-16 hours a week is typically necessary for a 4-credit course. Students must login on the first day of the quarter and follow individual faculty instructions. Students are expected to log on to their online course website 4-5 days a week. Online courses are designated in the schedule by section numbers beginning with the letter “H.”

**Hybrid:** These courses meet both on campus and online. Students may be expected to attend at least half of the class sessions on campus on dates specified by the instructor. Students who enroll in a Hybrid course that uses Blackboard must meet all Minimum Computer Requirements, Minimum Computer Skills Requirements, and Instructor Requirements. These may be found on the college’s **My Blackboard** page. Hybrid courses are designated in the schedule by section numbers beginning with the letter “J.”

**Live Classroom:** These courses meet primarily online at specific times designated by the instructor.

# Student Services/Grades

## Educational Opportunity Center (EOC)

The Educational Opportunity Center (EOC) is a comprehensive counseling referral program providing FREE academic, vocational, career and financial information to eligible adults (age 19 and above) in the 29-county Appalachian area. EOC will help you:

- explore college options
- choose a college or vocational school
- complete admissions and financial aid applications
- find scholarships, grants, and loans
- learn time management and college survival skills

**Are you eligible for EOC Services?** EOC services are offered FREE to adults who are age 19 and above and/or:

- low-income
- first generation in their family to enter college
- high-school or college dropouts

*To be eligible, you must meet at least one of the three criteria above and you must live in the 29-county region of Appalachia Ohio. The 29 counties include Adams, Athens, Belmont, Brown, Carroll, Clermont, Columbiana, Coshocton, Gallia, Guernsey, Harrison, Highland, Hocking, Holmes, Jackson, Jefferson, Lawrence, Meigs, Monroe, Morgan, Muskingum, Noble, Perry, Pike, Ross, Scioto, Tuscarawas, Vinton, and Washington.*

# Financial Aid/College Costs/Refund Information

## Payment Options and Financial Aid

All tuition and fees must be paid in full before a registration is complete. Payments may be made in person and secure drop boxes are located on each campus. The College accepts Visa and MasterCard. Online credit card payments may be made at [www.sccc.edu](http://www.sccc.edu) and the MYSSCC link. Once on MYSSCC simply click on the My Profile tab and then My Account. Credit card payments may also be made by calling any campus bookstore or the Admissions Office at 1-800-628-7722, ext. 2607.

### Other payment options available are as follows:

A contractual Deferred Payment Option is available by placing a \$100 deposit and completing a Deferred Payment Option contract by the deadline date as listed in the college quarterly schedule. Deferred Payment Options must be completed prior to each quarter. Payment of fees must be completed prior to registration for the next quarter.

All registered students must make payment or arrangements to pay or have their Financial Aid Application in the financial aid office by March 8, 2012. Arrangements to pay include financial aid, an approved third-party agreement, or a completed deferred payment plan. (\$100 deposit required). Students registering between March 8-23, 2012 must make payment or arrangements to pay at the time of registration. Arrangements to pay include financial aid, an approved third-party agreement, or a completed deferred payment plan (\$100 deposit required).

Federal and state financial aid is available for those who qualify. By completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA), eligibility is determined for a variety of federal and state financial aid programs. For more information concerning financial aid, please call the Financial Aid Office at 1-800-628-7722, ext 2610.

Student loans are available for all students who qualify. Eligibility is determined by completing the FAFSA. The freshman loan amount is \$3500 and the sophomore loan amount is \$4500. Additional loans may be available upon written request.

Possibility of fully funding your education is attainable through a combination of the above referenced payment options. For more information, please call 1-800-628-7722, ext. 2610.

*Please Note: Financial aid is based on the number of credit hours that the student is registered for at the end of the drop/add period for the whole quarter term. Students who register for a mini-term within a quarter term MUST be registered for those mini-term classes prior to the end of the first two weeks of the quarter in order to be considered for financial aid purposes. Questions concerning this may be answered by calling 1-800-628-7722, ext. 2610.*

## College costs

## Return of Title IV Funds

Students who receive Title IV financial aid (Pell Grant, Federal Supplemental Educational Grant, and Federal Direct Loans) who do not complete their classes for a period of enrollment (quarter) will be responsible to return unearned aid back to the Department of Education. Failure to return unearned aid will result in loss of future eligibility for any Title IV financial aid. The 60% date for Spring Quarter is May 10, 2012. See college catalog for detailed policy.

## Refund Policy

**When withdrawal procedures are followed, the College will refund fees within a reasonable period of time according to the following schedule:**

### Withdrawal completed:

Before start of quarter (Before March 26).....Refund 100%  
By the last day of the second week (Apr. 6).....Refund 100%  
After second week of quarter (after Apr. 6).....No refund

**Any flexibly scheduled course (course sections meeting dates other than the full quarter) receives a 100% refund during the first 20% of the course only.**

## Who knew education could be free?

The Adult Incentive Scholarship offers adults the opportunity to take one college course, tuition free, during one quarter of the academic year. The purpose of this scholarship is to serve as an incentive for folks who may be interested in exploring the possibility of going to college but aren't yet ready to make the financial commitment.

Criteria for this scholarship include adults who: 1) have not been enrolled in high school or college in the past five years; 2) have not earned a bachelor's degree or higher; and 3) completed the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA).

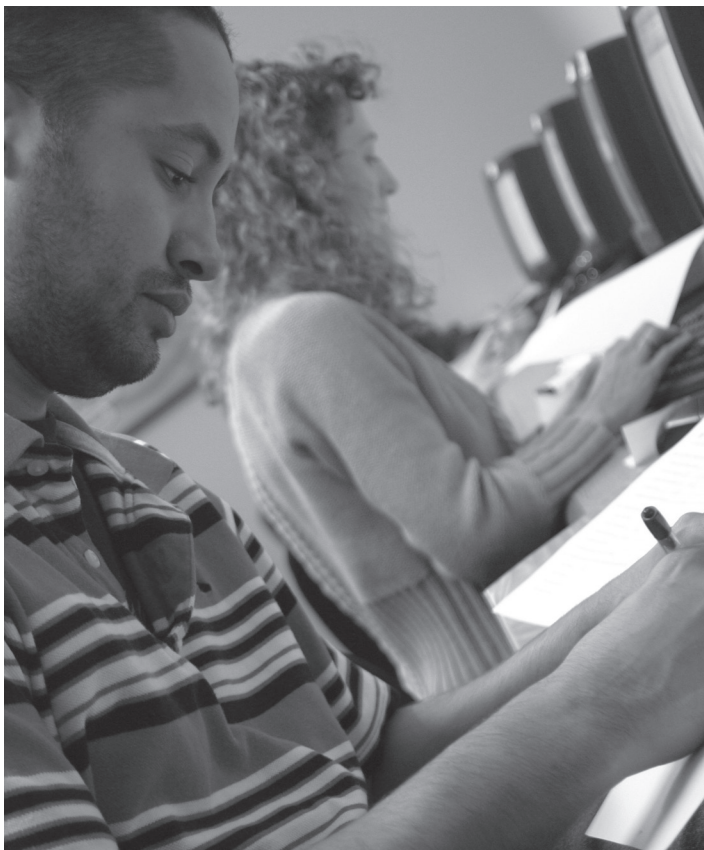
