

Senior Citizens

A Senior Citizen is defined as any person age sixty or over on the first day of class. Residency rules as stated in the catalog, will apply to Senior Citizens.

Senior Citizens taking non-credit courses (ex. ENRC 392 Z01 Crafts) through Continuing Education pay the stated fee for the course (fees paid by students are the only revenue that offsets expenses) and have their space reserved in the class at the point of registration.

Senior Citizens taking credit courses (ex. FNAR 142 SO1 Crafts) for audit (receive grade of "T" and credit cannot be used to meet degree requirements) may take the course on a tuition-free, space-available basis (the college does not receive tuition or state subsidy for these so there is really no revenue generated for the college). Lab fees are applicable in all cases.

Senior Citizens need to complete the Senior Citizen Discount form each quarter, and their registration is not posted until the week before the term begins since registration is limited to space being available in the class.

Senior Citizens taking credit courses (ex. FNAR 142 SO1 Crafts) for credit (receive a letter grade and credit will be used to meet degree requirements) may be eligible for a discount on tuition (must make appointment with Financial Aid Office to complete appropriate paperwork). The college would receive revenue for tuition, if applicable, and also state subsidy. Their registration is posted at the time received and their space is reserved in the class.

Senior Citizens must decide which option they are choosing at the point of registration for the course.
