## **Gearing up for Fall**

As the summer fades, the College is picking up momentum for a strong start on August 21. In advance of the term, the College will host its annual Opening Week Activities. Among the topics are a variety of professional development opportunities as well as specific activities aimed at improving affordability and student enrollment.

Additionally, New Student Orientation returned to face-to-face delivery. Two evening sessions were held Mon. July 31, and Tues., Aug. 1. Special thanks to **Kaylynn Bell** for organizing the activities and to the many volunteers across the College who contributed in various ways.

Finally, while still early, weekly enrollment tracking suggests a modest uptick in our non-CCP student population and continued increases in CCP enrollment. As has been prioritized, the College continues to seek a rebalancing of enrollment in which non-CCP and CCP enrollment are both realizing increases.

## Patriot Palooza a Big Hit

Among the four priority areas included in the 2023-2025 Strategic Plan includes enrollment. Strategies in this area, among other things, emphasize **balancing the enrollment profile** and **being deliberate about enhancing our connection within communities where a physical campus no longer exists.**  One immediate activity emerging from the Communications Team included a month-long outreach initiative called Patriot Palooza. Joined by 17 volunteers, nearly 50 unique visits to businesses, agencies, county offices, schools, and special events across the five-county region were supported in July. Ranging from a casual drop-in to say, "Thank you for what you do and thank you for supporting Southern State" to sponsorship-like engagements with the broader community, Patriot Palooza was a hit.

## Deep Data Dive Schedule Announced

The Deep Data Dive series was launched in 2022 to enhance data transparency across the institution. The series included a variety of relevant topics that connected our college community to the data which defines the institution in various capacities. The Series was well attended and proved to be something worth continuing.

Included in the 2023-2025 Strategic Plan, the College prioritizes promoting **data transparency for informed decision-making**. The series will continue emphasizing some of our core data elements and include new topics such as a financial aid analysis and external data that impact programming, job prospects, etc. All presentations will be delivered virtually and should last no more than an hour.

## **ACADEMIC AND STUDENT AFFAIRS**

#### **Ohio Manufacturing Workforce Partnership Grant**

Southern State was awarded an Ohio Manufacturing Workforce Partnership grant for *Earn and Learn Technical Assistance* sessions to discover ways to develop and grow earn-and-learn programs. Consultant Aaron Burdette is the University of Cincinnati's Assistant Professor of Practice for Biomedical Engineering and NEXT Apprenticeship program Faculty Lead. He will meet with SSCC faculty/staff and local community partners in September for a series of workshops on developing/enhancing co-op-type program options.

#### **Great Minds Fellowship Program Grant**

Southern State was awarded a Great Minds Fellowship Program grant in the amount of \$96,199.00 from the Ohio Department of Higher Education (ODHE). The grant will provide financial aid to Ohio resident students who are within two years of graduating with degrees or certificates in Social Work, Marriage and Family Therapy, Mental Health Counseling/Counselor, Psychiatric/Mental Health Nurse/Nursing, and Substance Abuse/Addiction Counseling. Students in our Human and Social Services program and Chemical Dependency program will benefit from these funds.

#### Adjunct | CCP Professional Development Event

On Wednesday, July 26, the Adjunct Faculty Committee hosted the annual Adjunct | CCP Professional Development event on Central Campus from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.. Dr. Goodwin and I welcomed the group and thanked them for their good work and dedication to academic excellence. The instructors each selected three of nine sessions to attend: Assessment; Teaching Methodologies; Library Services; Best Practices; Student Engagement; Adjunct Faculty Q&A; and three sessions specifically geared toward CCP teachers. The day's activities concluded with division breakout meetings. Kudos to the Adjunct Faculty Committee, presenters, and staff for all the time and work put into making this day a content-rich, informational event. A total of **63** people attended, including 18 adjunct faculty members and 25 CCP teachers.

### **Student Affairs Summer Retreat**

A Student Affairs Summer Retreat was held on Friday, July 21, on Central Campus. Following opening activities, Dr. Wise presented on overcoming a silo mentality within the department. Breakout teams brainstormed, then offered ideas on *how to break down silos*.

The final topics of the retreat centered on clear expectations for Student Affairs personnel and the importance of quality customer service through communication, consistency, trust, and relationship building.

To provide additional opportunities for students to enroll in classes, the Central Campus Student Affairs offices will offer extended hours for Fall 2023 term. The Brown County Campus will return to operational hours on Friday.

#### **People in the News**

Two Faculty members were promoted to full professor for the coming school year: **Rainee Angles**, Professor of Speech and Theater, and **Bill Henry**, Professor of Biology.

**Meg Storrs,** Administrative Assistant for Southern State's Nursing Department, has graduated as a fellow of the newest class of the Ohio Leadership Academy for Student Success. Sponsored by the Ohio Association of Community Colleges, the academy is the first of its kind in the nation to gather mid-level faculty and staff for a year of training, exchanging ideas, and immersion in how to promote student success.

**Rainee Angles,** Professor of Speech and Theatre and SSCC Theatre Director, was cast as Hunyak in Wilmington College's Summer Theater production of *Chicago* in mid-July.

## **HUMAN RESOURCES**

## **Security**

The State approved \$5 million in funding to be divided among 33 colleges and universities for safety improvements. Awards from the state's Campus Safety Grant Program, in general, will be used for security improvements on Ohio campuses, including alarms, cameras, and locks. To be eligible for grant funding, colleges were required to have conducted a security and vulnerability assessment to identify potential areas for improvement as part of the grant application. Southern State coordinated with the Ohio School Safety Center professionals to

conduct the assessment on its campuses. The Ohio School Safety Center, a division of the Ohio Department of Public Safety, reviewed the campus safety grant applications in consultation with the Ohio Department of Higher Education.

In January, the College was awarded an estimated \$149,000; the majority of the funds will be used at the Highland County Campus to replace exterior doors, add additional security cameras, and make other security enhancements. The work is estimated to be completed by the end of the 2022-23 academic year.

Articles related to the safety grant have recently appeared in the *Times-Gazette* and *The Highland County Press.* 

**Gary Heaton**, the College Security and Emergency Response Coordinator, was one of the 1,300 attendees at the two-day Ohio School Safety Summit at the Columbus Convention Center, the week of July 25. Governor DeWine opened the Ohio School Safety Summit. Keynote speaker Dr. Dewey Corneel, Professor at the University of Virginia and developer of the Comprehensive School Threat Assessment Guidelines (CSTAG), covered school threat assessments. Dr. Amanda Nickerson, Professor, and Director of the Alberti Center for Bullying Abuse and Prevention at the University at Buffalo, covered bullying prevention and intervention.

## **Training and Development**

The Human Resource Department continues to build training and learning courses in the Dayforce Learning platform for employees. Required annual employee training is currently being made and scheduled for September 2023.

The Human Resource Department will attend the Dayforce Annual training event the first week in October. Dayforce is the College's Human Capital Management (HCM) software which contains recruitment, talent and workforce management, payroll, HR, and benefits features. This event provides opportunities for cross-training, maintaining compliance, and learning how other customers utilize the platform.

Ashley Barbone, Senior Assistant Attorney General at the Ohio Attorney General Dave Yost's office, will be on campus for Opening Week (Tuesday, August 15)<sup>-</sup> to provide Title IX Training to employees. Title IX requires institutions to protect all students, faculty, and staff from sexbased discrimination, a term that includes both sexual harassment and sexual violence.

## Compliance

An internal audit of the Nursing Faculty and Nursing Adjunct ACEN/OBN files is being led by **Crystal Howland**, Coordinator of Benefits and Compensation. This is being done in advance of the ACEN/OBN visit. This audit will be looking at several documents, including certifications, licensures, transcripts, and pertinent vaccination records.

## **Benefits and Compensation**

#### **Benefits**

Crystal Howland, Coordinator of Benefits and Compensation, worked with Anthem, Ceridian, and Horan to set up data feeds for all Anthem lines of coverage (medical/dental/vision). The data feeds enable Anthem to obtain data directly from Ceridian for new or ending benefit enrollments caused by hiring, termination, or work/life event enrollments. The feed reduces the amount of time spent manually entering data and reduces the risk of inaccurate information being entered into the system. The Coordinator reviews reports generated each week for any discrepancies. Anthem is working with ARORx to set up similar data feeds for pharmacy coverage. The data feed for Anthem and ARORx went live on July 21.

A thank you to **Tyler Bick**, Technology Coordinator who has been working with Crystal to overhaul the employee Benefits, Health & Wellness web pages. The updated web pages went live on July 24. The new layout was designed with ease of use in mind for employees. Employees were made aware of the new layout in an email on August 1.

#### Wellness

Employee wellness credit events hosted in July included:

July 11 – CPR Training & Certification Course: The course was sponsored by our Workforce Development team and led by **Bruce Fugate**.

July 12 – Identifying and Addressing Employee Turnover: This is a webinar sponsored by college partners at ImpactSolutions.

July 26 – Benefits Review and Medicare Enrollments: This is designed to be one-on-one meetings with Tracy Barnes, our representative at Enrollment Management Services (EMS).

Preparations are underway for the upcoming Employee Health & Wellness Fair. HealthWorks has been secured to provide four technicians for biometric screenings for full-time employees and any covered spouses. The Coordinator is securing additional vendors to include representatives from Horan, Voya, OPERS, STRS, Walgreens, and various other Benefit providers and local businesses. The 2023/2024 Wellness Fair is set for Friday, October 6 from 7:00 a.m. – 11:00 a.m.. It is open to all employees and covered spouses.

### **Partnerships**

The Human Resource Department has partnered with the Ohio Means Jobs (OMJ) Youth Training Program. This program is designed to provide employment opportunities to aid youths between the ages of 14-24 that may have roadblocks such as low income, lack of high school diploma, lack of transportation, and or another issue that may impact their ability to gain employable skills and experience.

**Bethany Baker**, who previously worked for SSCC as a Clinical Instructor, will join the team as a Full-Time Nursing Instructor beginning August 1. Bethany has worked at Adams County Regional Medical Center in both the Emergency Department and Medical/Surgical Telemetry. She obtained her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Ohio University.

Adjunct Instructors continue to be onboarded for the Fall term, including **Greta Galloway**, who is returning to teach Speech/Public Speaking.

The Law Enforcement Academy welcomes Darrell Keller to the team.

Division Coordinators that were selected for the 2023/2024 academic year included **Dr. Josh Montgomery** – Applied Science, **Jody Bishop** – Social Science, and **Nicole Sheppard** – Arts and Humanities, and **Jeff Tumbleson** – Business.

# INFORMATION TECHNOLOGY AND INFRASTRUCTURE

## **Highland County Campus Door Upgrades**

As mentioned earlier in this report, Southern State is moving forward with a project to replace entryway doors at the Highland County campus, thanks to Governor DeWine's 2022 Campus Safety Grant Program. Current doors are original to the building's construction and provide safety challenges with latching and locking due to extensive age and wear. This project also provides a valuable opportunity to reset our key strategy with new locks and improve tracking for those with key access.

This project has been in the planning stages for the past 18 months and includes replacing entry doors in the main lobby, the end of each hallway, both entrances to the Annex Building, and exterior doors for the Library. Special thanks to **Mindy Markey-Grabill**, VP of Human Resources, for securing the Campus Safety Grant.

## **Brown County Campus Facade Remediation Project**

The exterior stucco replacement project at Brown County Campus officially started on July 5 and significant progress is being made with demo and remediation moving forward faster than anticipated. Valley Construction is performing the work and targeting substantial completion by the end of August. Color selections are consistent with the building's original color selections.
