

Info session set May 29 for SSCC's electromechanical degree

Through a partnership between Southern State Community College and the DP&L Generation Center, students can earn an associate degree in Electromechanical Engineering or take general education courses that will fit into most academic pathways, all at the site in Manchester.

A free information session will be held 6 p.m. Thursday, May 29, at DP&L Generation Center, 401 Starks Drive, Manchester.

The associate degree in Electromechanical Engineering is designed as a four-semester track. Successful completion of the program could lead to employment with various engineering and manufacturing companies using the principles and theories of engineering, mathematics, and science. Graduates may prepare specifications for materials, test for quality control, study ways to improve manufacturing efficiency, supervise production works, work as field representatives, install and repair technical equipment, or write repair and operation manuals.
