Area residents who passed the General Education Development (GED) test or completed the Adult High School Workforce Diploma Program were honored recently at the 36th annual Adult Opportunity Center's Recognition celebration at Southern State Community College's Central Campus in Hillsboro.

During the 2024-25 academic year, the Adult Opportunity Center served 162 students. Of those students, 52 percent improved at least one academic level with 37 students earning a GED[®].

All books and materials are provided, and a choice of morning or evening classes focusing on adult literacy, GED preparation, college refresher courses, workforce education, and basic reading, writing and math skill improvement are available.
