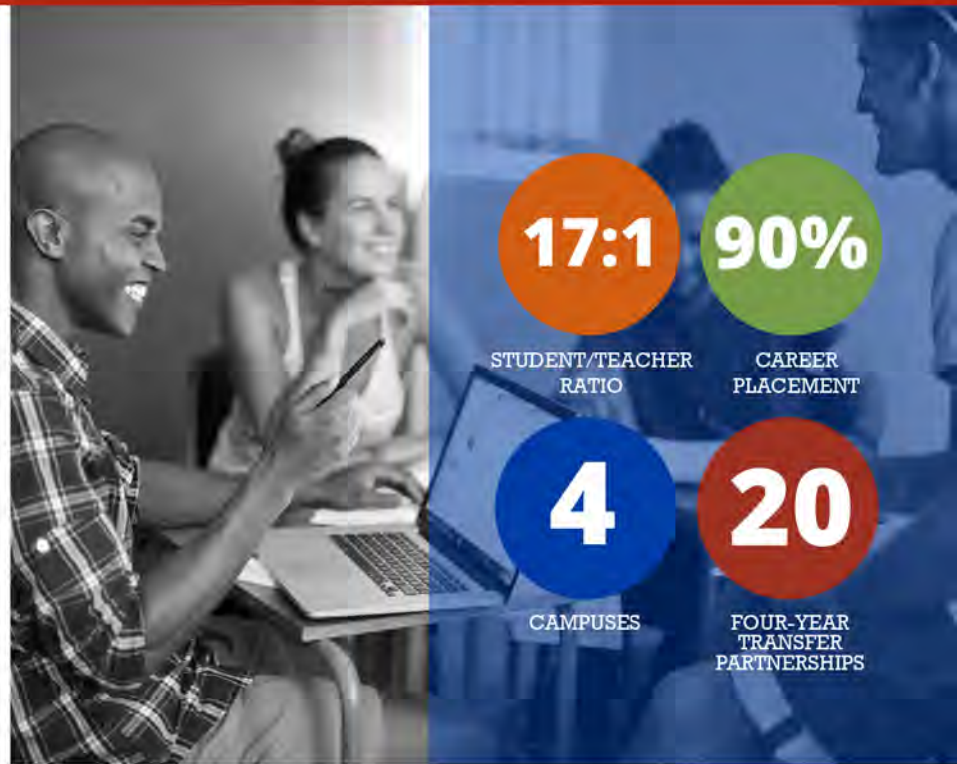

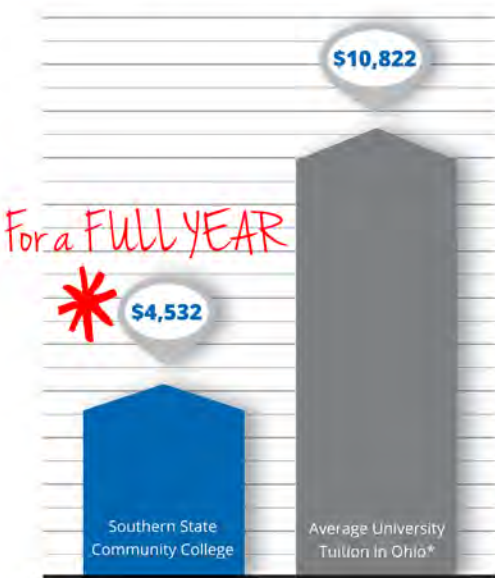

Truck Driving Academy
