Middle Childhood: Grades 4-9;

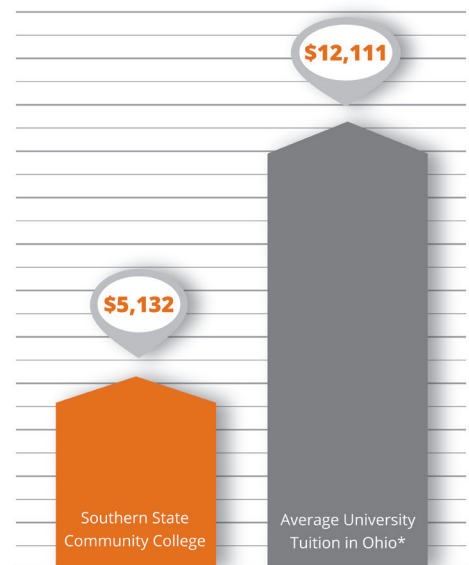
2 Content Areas: Science, Math, Language Arts, Social Studies

JOB OUTLOOK

According to the **U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics**, the employment of teachers is projected to **grow 7-8 percent** from 2020 to 2030, much faster than the average for all occupations. About **61,500 openings** for middle and high school teachers are projected each year, on average, over the decade. Many of those openings are expected to result from the need to replace workers who transfer to different occupations or exit the labor force, such as to retire.

Every year, many people earn their teaching degree and are poised to **make a difference** in the minds of future generations.

According to the National Center for Education Information (NCEI) the number of teachers employed is expected to grow to nearly 4 million.

You also may be surprised to learn that **salaries are competitive**. Generous benefits and extensive vacation time also make getting a teaching degree even better.

Associate of Arts Degree

To receive an Associate of Arts, the student must complete course work that satisfies the following guidelines:

- Ohio Transfer 36 (**36 semester credit hours**) must be satisfied.
- A minimum total of **60 semester credit hours of courses numbering 1100 or above** must be successfully completed.
- Course work must be distributed in the following manner (in all cases, courses taken to satisfy Ohio Transfer 36 may be included in these totals):

English / Communications – 9 hours
ENGL 1101 | ENGL 1102 | COMM 1115

Social Sciences – 9 hours
Courses from at least two areas:
Economics
History
Political Science
Psychology
Sociology

Electives – 21 hours

Mathematics & Science – 9 hours
At least one course in mathematics and two courses in science:

Mathematics
Biology
Chemistry or Physical Science

Arts & Humanities – 12 hours
Courses from at least two areas:

Film
Fine Art
Foreign Language
Literature
Philosophy
Theatre

Students are to plan their program with the help and approval of their Advisor. Students with specific baccalaureate goals should meet the degree requirements with electives that are approved by an advisor at the receiving institution.

Concentration in *Education*

A concentration is an academic focus within an Associates of Arts or Science Degree. Students must meet all requirements for the Associate of Arts or Science Degree, and Ohio Transfer 36 to qualify for a concentration, and need to plan their program with the help and approval of their Advisor.
