In Semester 1: students will complete their application for admission to the licensure program and will receive a waiver to take one upper division (300-400) class that is not a field practicum. Documentation of field hours in a classroom completed prior to transfer into Wilmington College will be counted as ED285 hours and that class will be waived.

In Semester 3: students will need to work to complete their content OAE for Primary Education (055). This must be passed prior to student teaching. Deadlines are posted in the Education Office.

Assuming you bring 60 hours in with your Associates' degree, you can reach the minimum number of hours (124) for the bachelors' degree in four semesters. If you transfer in less than 60 hours, you may need to stay for an additional semester to reach the 124 hours needed to graduate.

- If you complete an Associates of Arts or Associates of Science (NOTE: not an Associates of Applied Arts or Science), your general education requirements will be waived.
- If you take a mathematics course that is equivalent to our mathematics courses that are a higher number than our MT102 and MT103, we will substitute that transferred mathematics course for our Math for Teachers course sequence. We recommend a Math for Teachers course whenever possible because that content is on your licensure exam and the course serves as a good refresher for you.
- If you complete an equivalent to our ED130 Foundations of Education, you need to earn a B- or higher to avoid retaking the class. That is the required grade for the class at Wilmington College. Also, if you did field work as part of your class, please have documentation (time card, evaluation, etc.) that shows how many hours you completed so we have that in your record. If you transfer in an equivalent to our ED130, you will be asked to complete ED132. This is a one-credit hour online course that periodically will meet with the students in ED130 to hear guest speakers, complete paperwork, etc.
- If you transfer in either Human Development or Educational Psychology, you will need to have earned a B- or higher and you will be asked to take ED231, which picks up the other class. If you transfer in Human Development, ED231 will focus on Educational Psychology for you. If you transfer in Educational Psychology, ED231 will focus on Human Development for you. If you transfer in both classes, you will not need to take ED231.
