





As it stands now, Brock's life has been deeply altered forever by the events of Jan 17th and 18th. He will never be his happy go lucky self with that easy going personality and welcoming smile. His every waking minute is consumed with worry, anxiety, fear, and depression. You can see this in his face, the way he walks, his weakened voice, his lack of appetite. Brock always enjoyed certain types of food and is a very good cook himself. I was always excited to buy him a big ribeye steak to grill or to get his favorite snack for him. 



What constitutes sexual assault?



Sexual Assault Includes

- Rape—sexual intercourse against a person's will
- Forcible sodomy—anal or oral sex against a person's will
- Forcible object
 penetration—penetrating
 someone's vagina or anus,
 or causing that person to
 penetrate her or himself,
 against that person's will



Sexual Assault Examples (Continued)



- Martial Rape
- Unwanted sexual touching
- Sexual contact with minors, whether consensual or not
- Incest (Sexual intercourse or sexual intrusion between family members.)
- Any unwanted or coerced sexual contact



Characteristics of Consent

The person must be capable of making the decision – mentally and physically

Not made under threat or coercion (Consider power differential)

Clear and not assumed

What consent is NOT!

- A slurred verbal response (Impairment or incapacitation by alcohol or drugs)
- Physiological signs that are involuntary and associated with arousal, etc.
- A partner who is disengaged, nonresponsive, or visibly upset
- Assuming the wearing certain clothes, flirting, or kissing is an invitation for anything more
- Someone being under the legal age of consent, as defined by the state
- Pressuring someone into sexual activity by using fear or intimidation
- Assuming you have permission to engage in a sexual act because you've done it in the past



Executive Function & the Brain

Executive Functioning



Frontal lobe is responsible for much of the executive functioning of the brain.

These functions include:

Attention

Working memory

Planning, organizing

Forethought

Impulse control

Drinking



Sixteen Ounces



Average 8 Ounces



Watch Your Drink



- Cover or keep an eye on your glass
- Never leave your drink unattended
- Do not accept a drink from a stranger unless you see it poured



Set Boundaries

- Set Boundaries
- Clearly Communicate
- Be Assertive, passivity may be interpreted as permission. (UNC Charlotte Police and Public Safety, 2021)
- Go as a group to watch out for each other



Bystander Intervention

- Take your cues from the person who seems to be in trouble.
- Do not overreact but pay attention.
- Doing nothing is not an option.

Techniques

Go	up
and	say

Go up and say hello, acting as if you know them

Interrupt

Interrupt asking for directions, the time, etc.

Say

Say, "There you are; I have been looking for you. Let's go to the bathroom."

Pretend

Pretend you know them. "I have not seen you in ages. How are you? Come over and let's talk."

Spill

Accidentally spill a drink or drop change on the floor between the harasser and the victim.





Delegate

Techniques

Look for someone who is in charge or can help:

- Security
- Bouncer
- Manager

Then follow up with the victim to see how to assist,





Document

Techniques

All phones have video capabilities.

- Have someone video the harassment
- This may turn out to be useful for the victim later
- Ask the victim what they would like to do with the video
- Never post it online





Delay

Techniques

- Stay with the victim to offer support
- Ask what would be useful
- Ask if the victim would like to be accompanied to their final disposition
- Offer to help make a report of the incident





Direct

Techniques:

Ask the victim how they are doing Ask Ask Ask the victim if you or both should leave Ask Ask the victim if you should call for help Emphasize Emphasize to the victim they are not alone
