This module is an introduction to the development of approaches to learning during the preschool years, ages 3-5, and is aligned to Ohio's Early Learning and Development Standards in the Approaches Toward Learning domain. The standards for approaches toward learning center on the foundational behaviors, dispositions and attitudes that children bring to social interactions and learning experiences. The standards include children's demonstration of initiative and curiosity and their motivation to participate in new and varied experiences and challenges. These behaviors are fundamental to children's abilities to take advantage of learning opportunities and to set, plan and achieve goals for themselves. This domain also includes children's level of attention, engagement and persistence as they do a variety of tasks. These factors are consistent predictors of academic success (Duncan et al., 2007). Finally, children's creativity, innovative thinking and flexibility of thought allow them to think about or use materials in unconventional ways and to express thoughts, ideas and feelings in a variety of media. **Please note: Session 2 is from 12:30 p.m. – 3:30p.m.**
